MFAQ

These were selected based on generally asked questions by those we solicited from. I think you might have those in mind as well, so I list them here to help you understand us better.

1. Tell me more about Help Me Too Foundation, what does it do, and who is your recipients?

Answer: Help Me Too Foundation is designed to help children and youth through education. Help Me Too is set up differently from other foundation. Many foundations have huge amount of money and they funds other organizations.

Help Me Too is a small but effective foundation focusing on education. In order to help our focus succeeds, we need to associate four other components to it:

- i) Nutrition (we have to feed them so they stomach won't prevent them from learning)
- ii) Basic Health (we want to make sure the children or the youth are in fairly good health to sustain the ability to learn)
- iii) Shelter (if they are worry where they going to spend the night, rain or shine, they learning potential can be impaired)
- iv) Survival through self-sustainer (we are giving them a fish while showing them how to catch their own fish. Each is placed on a path to a career or a trade by the time they reach High School

2. How can my church, my organization, or I help, Help Me Too help others?

Answer: There are over hundreds of ways you, your church, or your organization can help!

3. Do you believe in prayer?

Answer: If prayer is your way out of tough time, you can make it a priority to first pray for this organization. If otherwise, wish us the best. All we need to do is change a child's life for the better.

4. What kinds of help does Help Me Too have and who will benefit from my help?

Answer: Your help doesn't just help one child but a village and Help Me Too is desperately in need your financial assistance!

Why? You ask.

- a. We need your financial assistance to pay the teachers to teach the children
- b. We need your assistance to buy school supplies for the children

- c. We need your assistance to buy food to cook for the children
- d. We need your assistance to pay cook to cook the for children
- e. We need your assistance to pay for the place we rented for the school
- f. We need your assistance to buy other stuff needed to run the school
- g. We need your assistance to build Help Me Too Scholarship Funds (US only). We can set the scholarship on your name , church or organization to support the area of your choice.
- h. We need your assistance to collect clothes, school supplies, dried food
- i. Any other things that can be of service

5. What can I personally do to help?

Answer:

- a. You can sponsor one child for \$30.00 a month. That would cover most of what she needs for 30 days. We assign the child to you so you can follow his/her progress all the way through; including his/her photo (this is not adoption).
- b. You can purchase a block for \$1000, \$2000, \$5000, \$10,000 or any amount in between or any amount after.
- c. If you alone cannot handle \$30.00, get someone else with and split it, or do what you can afford.
- d. You can collect clothes, shoes, and school supplies from the church members or your neighbors and friends.
- e. You ask your church to get on board to support Help Me Too
- f. You donate sewing machine (s), copy machines, papers
- g. You can donate computers, computer desks, school chairs, regular desk, file cabinets, tables, etc.
- h. You can set up food drive, school supplies drive at convenient locations
- i. You can donate land, house, trust fund, car, boat, or anything of some value.
- j. You take a trip to Haiti to volunteer or to train, if you have the skills

6. What “purchase a clock?”

Answers: A block is a regular concrete building block. Your name will be engraved on it forever on that block of the school. Just like the widow at Sarepta, your name will be spoken of for generation to come.

7. Is my donation, small or large tax deductible and will I get a receipt stated so?

Answer: Absolutely! Your donation, large or small is fully tax deductible to the extent of the IRS 501 (c) (3) code.

8. What can my church do to help?

Answer: Good question! A church without some sort of missionary support is not fulfilling the greatest commission that Jesus commissioned church with. If your church is willing to help, the help can come in many ways:

- a. The church can collect donations on a regular basis by requesting the congregants to contribute \$10, \$20, \$30, or more per person and then send it to Help Me Too.
- b. The can set up food drive, school supplies drive at convenient locations
- c. The can donate land, house, trust fund, car, truck, busses, boat, or anything of some value.
- d. The church can purchase a block for \$1000, \$2000, \$5000, \$10,000 or any amount in between or any amount after.
- e. The church can send missionary to Haiti with Help Me Too. Remember, a church must send missionary. It's part of what churches do.
- f. If you donate enough to build the school, we'll name the building after you!

9. What “purchase a clock, how can I explain that to my church?”

Answers: A block is a regular concrete building block. The church's name will be engraved on it forever on that block of the school.

10. I have an organization or I work for an organization, how can an organization help, Help Me Too in the US or in Haiti?

Answer: Wonderful question and the answer is simple! An organization can do any of the above

11. I have a bunch of good boxes, barrels, drums; can they be useful to your organization?

Answer: Yes. You need items such as yours to ship food and other things to Haiti.

12. I have a car, a truck, a bus but it does not work, can Help Me Too benefit from it?

Answer: Yes, we'll send a tow truck to pick it up and sell it to the junk yard for cash.

13. I've heard from the radio or television I should not give to small organization such as yours because there are too many scams and fake organization out there. What makes Help Me Too different and how can I be sure that my donation serves the purpose?

Answer: If you didn't ask this question, I would have prime you to ask it. The best way to answer your question is to tell you little about the founder (Me).

I started helping others since 1979 in the US with my own money. I thought over 11, 800 people to read and write their name for the first time, just a missionary did for me when I was 17 years of age. I have been given scholarship to US students to cover book cost, transportation (bus pass) and food allowance since 2003. I started the free school in Haiti in 2005 but never solicit anything from anyone. From 2007 to 2010, we have fed and clothed over 600 people per week. This is just what is recorded!

Last but not least, I am 60 years old with two grown independent children who can do without me. I need not to be rich now. I simply want to make a difference in the US that gave me to opportunity to be somebody in the eyes of some, and to go back where I came from to help those in need.

14. I have heard people say that and I quote “United States has many non-school kids, orphans, homeless, and hungry children, why should I or anyone else supports project in Haiti. What do you do here to help?”

Answer: What makes US the world’s #1 country is our generosity. The US supports the world one way or another. Haiti sitting is US backyard at roughly 710 miles in distance (1 hr and 25 minutes), and it is because, US planes cannot travel over Cuba. My last trip to Haiti in February 2014, my plane had 175 passengers, 8 of us were black and I didn’t know who from the 8 black who were Haitians.

I said this to say that I am not the only one who cares for the children of Haiti. If you see the needs there, you would too. I invite you to take a trip with me at your convenience.

15. Don’t you think we should give to those big giant organizations such as Red Cross, Salvation Army, World vision, just to name a few?

Answer: You and I are aware what is going on with big organizations you’ve mentioned! We all heard how much money Red Cross has raised for Haiti, where is the money?

It looks like the heart quake happened last week in Haiti. Our school is on the skirt of the Port-au-Prince, about 20 minutes away. Until now in 2014, we have not seen Red Cross or one employee. The town lost people, homes, and other stuff, Where is Red Cross.

It is small organizations such as Help Me Too who get in corners, the holes, and the abandoned areas. Your dollar serves its purpose with a small organization such as Help Me Too because of our low overhead and a caring heart. If you feel led to donate to Red Cross or any other big one, it’s your privilege but when you do, pass on the crumbs to us here.

16. If I have no money to donate, what kind of skills do I need to either volunteer here in the US or In Haiti?

Answer:

- a) There is no skill that is useless to God. In the US, we need people to help us raise funds and school supplies, clothes and shoes through friends, churches, organizations, etc.
- b) You can help us promote Help Me Too to others or online through social media. Our Facebook page is www.facebook.com/helpmetoo.org
- c) In Haiti, we need school teachers, Nurses, doctors, psychologists, counselors, (computer techs later one) If you can and you would like to go to Haiti with and help, we would be delighted but you would need to raise money for the airline fair. Twice a year we would plan a trip to Haiti.

17. Is there any other I, or others can help, Help Me Too change others’ life, particularly the children?

Answer: Yes. Any other way you wish or can help. Follow your heart!
